This reversible intarsia beanie exudes organic charm with abstract, asymmetrical color blocking that evokes geological or arboreal silhouettes. It makes for a fun and addictive knit that will spark your creativity — both in choosing your colors and adding your own embroidery, and in folding the brim of the finished hat any number of ways to create different looks.

The pattern includes 6 sizes, from newborn through adult large, and both written and charted instructions for the intarsia.

DETAILS

Sizing

To choose your size, measure the circumference of your head from the base of your skull, around your ears, and across your forehead (this should be the widest point of your head). Pattern is written with approximately 1" / 2.5 cm of negative ease across the size range. For finished hat measurements, see full schematic on the last page.

Gauge, needles, notions

GAUGE // 26 sts and 40 rows over 4"/10cm in stockinette

RECOMMENDED NEEDLES // US 3 (3.25mm) 32"/80cm circular

NOTIONS // crochet hook & scrap yarn (for provisional cast on), darning needle, intarsia bobbins

Total yarn requirements

MARBLE was designed in Knitting for Olive Cotton Merino, a light fingering weight yarn that makes beautiful, uniform fabric.

Abbreviations

CDD	center double decrease: sl2 tog knitwise, k1, pssso (centered decrease; 2 sts dec'd)	pm	place stitch marker
cont	continue	prev	previous
dec('d)	decrease (decreased)	rep	repeat
inc('d)	increase (increased)	RH	righthand
k	knit	RLI	right lifted increase: lift right leg of the stitch below the next stitch on LH needle onto the LH needle and knit it (right leaning increase, 1 st inc'd)
LH	lefthand	rs	right side
LLI	left lifted increase: lift the left leg of the stitch 2 rows below the stitch on RH needle onto LH needle and knit it through the back loop (left leaning increase, 1 st inc'd)	st(s)	stitch(es)
m	stitch marker	tog	together
p	purl	ws	wrong side

Construction overview

Beanie is worked flat all in one piece, with increases for the crown in the beginning and decreases for the crown at the end. Decorative chain stitch embroidery is added after all knitting is completed, and then the beanie is seamed lengthwise and folded up inside itself.

About intarsia

The colorwork technique employed in this pattern is intarsia, a method of knitting in which multiple yarns are worked individually in separate blocks of color across a single row. To avoid holes in your work when you switch yarns in the middle of a row, right after you work the last stitch in the old yarn, pass the yarn tail from the old yarn over the top of the new yarn, pushing it right up against the wrong side of the work. When you work the first stitch in the new yarn, the old yarn will be "caught" under the new yarn.

Be sure to maintain an even tension as you switch yarns, especially in rows where you have to float the new yarn across multiple stitches of the old yarn to create the pattern in the chart.

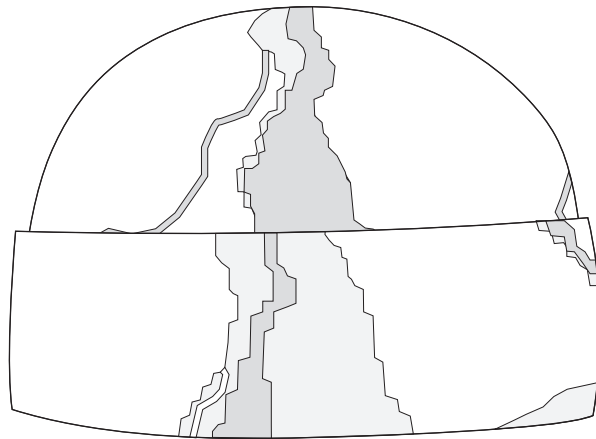
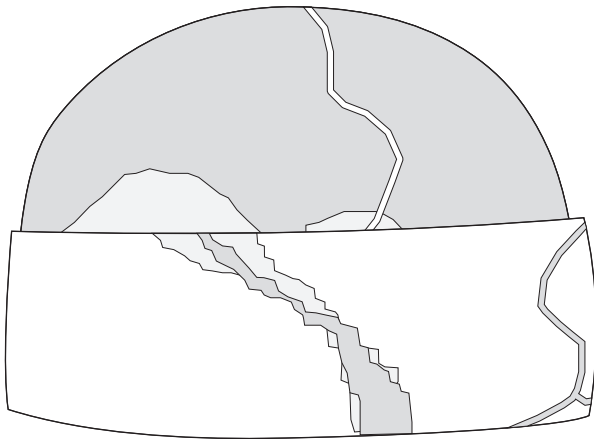
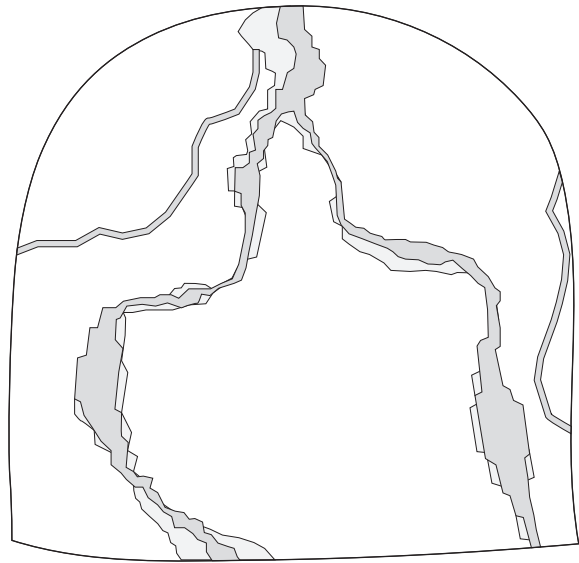
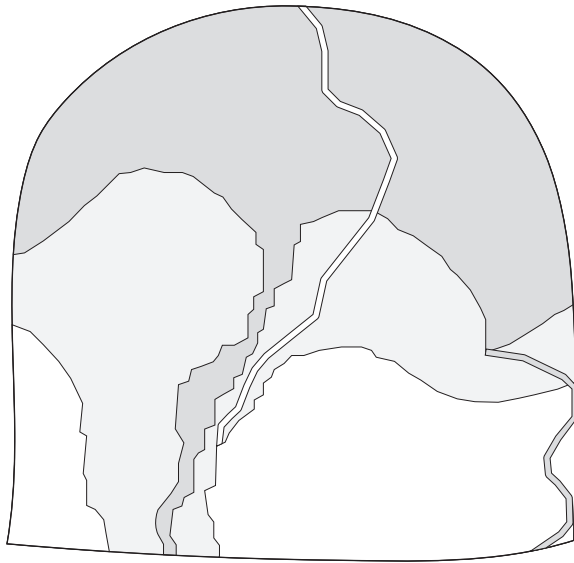
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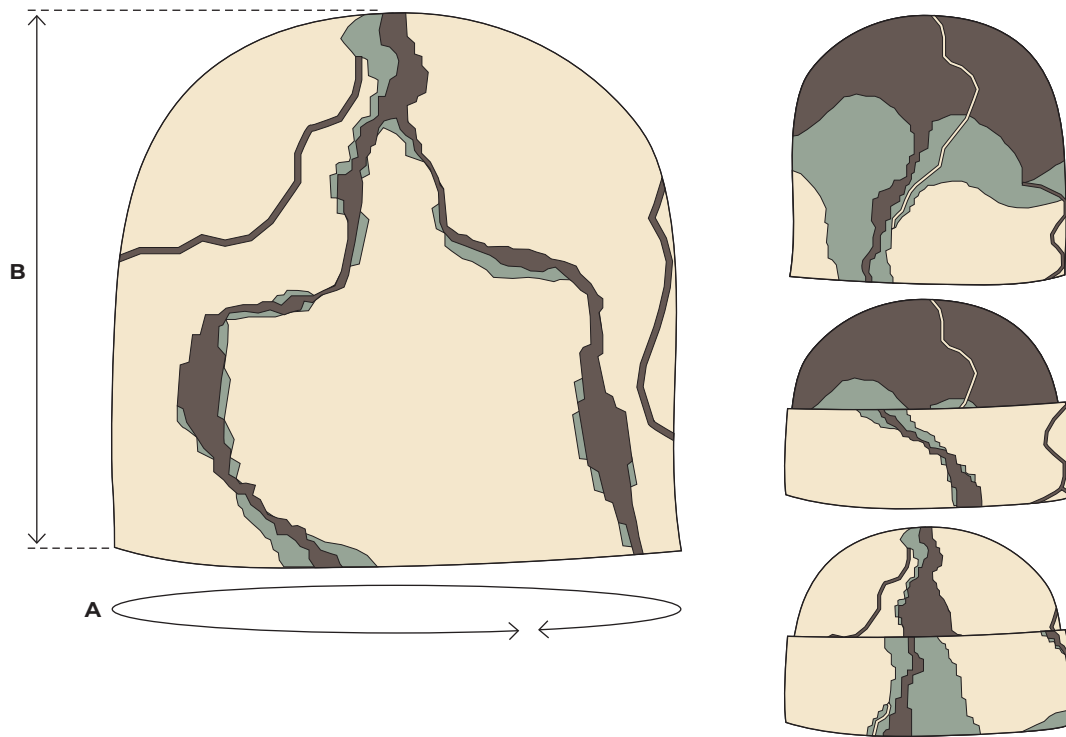
